

# HANDLE MATERIAL



## Cocobola Wood:

Because of its attractive color, texture, and waterproof characteristics, Cocobolo wood is the most common wood used for handle material. It typically comes from South America.

Used on the 1SW, 1M1, 1M2, 1M3, 1PCW, 1BCW, 1M8, 1M11, 1SLCW, 1M12, 2MULA1, 2MULA1, 2M13 & Money Clips



## Smooth White Bone:

"White Smooth Bone" is a great way to describe this to a customer. A much-less flattering description is domestic cattle chin-bone. Bleached and treated this material is typical in most bone-handled cutlery.

Used on the 1FWBI, 1FWBS & 1SLWB Knives as well as the letter openers and money clips.

Note: Specks and dark "pepper" type spots, as well as hairline fracture lines are common with smooth bone material.



## Zebra Wood

Man-made hardwood laminate. Very strong and durable.

Used on the 1PZW

## Cocobola Wood:

## Fox Fire Bone

Made from smooth bone, it is impregnated with colored dye to give it this unique color.

Used in the 1PFF, 1SLFF knives.

## Stone Inlaid:

These knives are each sent to various artist to inlay with a stone pattern, cut from predominantly turquoise and accented with various other stones and silver. Each is unique in its design and pattern.



## Shed Antler:

Each year Elk naturally shed their antlers, these antlers are collected in the wild. We then have artist shape and insert the antler into the handle.
